It is always good to come back to the gospel, to move beyond being familiar with the outline of Christ's life, teaching, death, and resurrection to going deeper, seeing new things, and understanding passages you previously did not understand.

In recent years, we have gone through Mark and John's gospels; now, we turn to Luke's gospel. Initially, I planned to go through as much of Luke as we could, finishing by Advent. As I was preparing, reading, and listening to the gospel, the more I felt that Luke's gospel required more time—more time for the Gospel to speak to us and to address what is unique to Luke's account.

THE GOSPEL OF LUKE

We're currently reading through the book of Mark and using the same 5 questions from Uncover Mark (https://uncover.org.au/mark/read/) and we use them to dive into what it says. People are also very open to praying and giving thanks to God. The main focus in our study is to move past this cultural knowledge - to use this knowledge to explore the Bible further and to understand the role of Jesus in the Bible and it's application to our life.

Of course reading the Bible together is the main thing, but it has also been great to enjoy the Latin American culture together, the warmth and family we all get from this group is so valuable! Not too long ago we had a social night where we had dinner, listened to Latin music, and everyone joined in a 'Pichanga' (casual soccer game). Praise God for this amazing community, and pray for its growth, that many people who are far from home can find family in this group.

Hagar's story is the original Handmaid's Tale. An Egyptian slave forced to act as a surrogate mother for Sarai, she is mistreated and finally cast out to die in the desert. But she is met and rescued by God, the God whom she names 'the God who sees'.







Abigail, described as 'clever and beautiful', is also wise, resourceful, courageous and prophetic. She turns back David and four hundred armed men, thus defying her husband, but saving her household from death and David from blood guilt. She prophesies David's future as King.

Huldah is also a prophet, the one chosen by five high ranking officials sent by King Josiah to inquire of the Lord concerning Judah's future.





Hagar is part of the story of Abraham, Abigail part of the story of David, and Huldah part of the story of King Josiah. Yet each in their own way disrupts and subverts the patriarchal narrative of which they are a part.


