REFLECTION - JOEY

As I prepare for my sermon series on 2 ? Corinthians, I came across the title of Chapter 8: "Eager Generosity," and it caught my attention as something extraordinary. Usually, people are eager to pursue something when they lack it. However, the uniqueness of this title lies in the fact that the Macedonian believers were eager to give, rather than to acquire. What makes it even more extraordinary is that the Macedonians were not wealthy; the Bible tells us that they were in great affliction and extremely impoverished. Yet they demonstrated generosity beyond the ordinary by earnestly pleading (eager) with Paul for the opportunity to participate in the offering (generosity).

I found myself thinking, "Wow! This extraordinary spirit of sacrificial giving is remarkable!" However, Paul redirects our focus to the abundance of God's grace rather than solely on the spirit of generosity exhibited by the Macedonians.

November is the month of thanksgiving at our Church, and for the past month, we have been encouraging brothers and sisters to reflect on God's guidance throughout the past year and offer words of thanksgiving. As we collected testimonies from our members, I realized even more profoundly how God's grace has touched the lives of our brothers and sisters, becoming a blessing to our church. It truly reflects the essence of fellowship in Christ – a fellowship of abundance. This abundance, however, is not defined by material wealth but by the richness of inner life. The former is temporary, while the latter is eternal. All

this is made possible because Jesus Christ took on our "poverty" (separation from God due to sin) so that

we may be enriched (reconciled with God). All of this is revealed through the selfless act of Jesus on the cross, showing the inner heart of God's love. In other words, the love of God is transparent through the redemption of Jesus Christ, enabling us to see God's grace.

I believe that the fellowship of the church is built on the foundation of this redeeming grace, inspiring us to imitate Christ by offering ourselves to manifest the grace of Christ. It is not hindered by external challenges or poverty, just as it was with the Macedonian believers. Rather, these external challenges serve as a catalyst that compresses our generous hearts even more.

In conclusion, I would like to borrow a poem by Watchman Nee as a fitting end to this reflection:

Unless the olive is crushed to pulp,
it cannot become oil;
Unless the grapes are pressed into the winepress,
they cannot turn into wine;
Unless the lavender is distilled,
it cannot release its fragrance;
Lord, do I also need to experience the challenges You
allow?

Every strike is a true benefit,
For what You take away, You replace with Yourself.
Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!




BOOK RECOMMENDATIONS

To help parents engage with children on personal body safety, we have purchased 2 books:




My Body! What I Say Goes!

MISSION NEWS - BCA

Since the mid-1990s the fastest growing group in terms of religious adherence in Australia has been no religion. The major denominations have been ineffective in responding to this opportunity or challenge, and the 2021 census spells out the consequences this. Between 1996 and 2021, the proportion of census respondents declaring no religion increased from 16.6 per cent to 38.9 per cent. The proportion nominating a Christian allegiance fell from 70.9 per cent to 43.9 per cent. On this basis no religion will overtake Christianity in 2026.

For us, these statistics are disturbing, but, at a personal level, merely inconvenient. The consequence of a church's closing is an extra 5 to 10 minutes' drive on Sunday. In the outer suburbs and on the metropolitan fringes the cost is greater. However, it is regional and rural areas where the consequence of declining church allegiance take its greatest toll.

Take the Central Queensland Diocese, which is based on Rockhampton, as an example. It has a population of 220,000 people and covers 570,000 square kilometres. It takes 15 hours to drive the 1268 kilometres across the diocese. To service the Diocese there are five stipendiary clerics including the Bishop and the Registrar. In bureaucratic parlance the Diocese has 4.2 FTE staff. The staff is supplemented by 9 active retired clergy, 15 people with permission to officiate, a locum, a deacon and 99 authorised lay ministers.

Jen Hercott has been in the Diocese for eight years and is the longest-serving cleric.

The Diocese has been under-funded from the day it was created. Today the financial position is parlous. The Bishop's stipend is being paid out of the See Endowment Fund. This fund is able to sustain him at the current rate until September 2026. A couple of years ago the Diocese obtained legal advice about winding up because of the impact of redress claims.

To put this in perspective, in the 60-70s the Diocese had approximately 27 incumbents, 12 curates, a full time Registrar, two Archdeacons and a Bishop all fully remunerated.

We have decided to give our relationship with BCA a more intentional focus by supporting the Registrar of this Diocese, Jen Hercott, who is being supported by BCA.

Jen will provide us with regular insights into life in a regional and rural environment and a presentation Jen made to a Queensland BCA conference about the Diocese earlier this year will be put on elvanto and Facebook pages.

In addition, Bishop Grice will be the speaker at BCA Victoria's annual general meeting and dinner on the 20th April next year and we are hoping that he will be able to able to join us while he is in Melbourne to acquaint us personally with what life is like in the mission field of Central Queensland where, according to the 2021 census, in Rockhampton, Anglicans finish third behind Roman Catholics and No Religion in terms of religious affiliation.
