# BOOK RECOMMENDATIONS

## A Reckless God? Currents and Challenges in the Christian Conversation with Science

John Pilbrow, Chris Mulherin

What sort of God would create a world full of life yet plaqued by earthquakes and genetic disorders? The Christian God is the loving 'reckless' God who, like the devoted father of the prodigal son, risks himself for the sake of relationship. This book includes contributions from theologians Alister McGrath and Jurgen Moltmann, astrophysicist Jennifer Wiseman and physicists Tom

McLeish and John Pilbrow. Jointly published by the Australian group ISCAST Christians in Science and Technology and The Melbourne Anglican, the book also includes chapters by some familiar to St Tom's: addiction medicine specialist Alan Gijsbers , engineer/ philosopher Rev. Chris Mulherin (and Denise Cooper-Clarke).

It also includes responses to prominent atheists Richard Dawkins, Lawrence Krauss, Stephen Fry and Alain de Bouton. "This impressive collection shows that, far from there being a conflict between science and Christian faith, the interaction furnishes fruitful dialogue and mutual enrichment" (astrophysicist and Church of England priest Dr. Rodney Holder).

#### King's Cross


Timothy Keller





## A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY: ROBERT CRAIG

During 2022, St Tom's received a generous bequest from the estate of Dr Robert Craig, a former member of St Tom's and earlier of St Michael and All Angels' Bennetswood. Robert's ashes are interred in the Memorial Garden, but lockdown restrictions in March 2020, when he died, meant he had no funeral.

Robert was educated at Murrumbeena State School, Melbourne Boys High, the University of Melbourne and at Lincoln College Oxford. He became Senior Lecturer in Chemistry at the University of Melbourne and Honorary Fellow of the University after his retirement (which meant that during the early years of his retirement Robert spent many unpaid hours developing and monitoring First Year Chemistry Pre-lab sessions).



Apart from a period in Oxford gaining his D. Phil, Robert lived

most of his adult life in a house on the block adjoining the church boundary, to the North. He never married and lived with his unmarried sister, Margaret, until she died in 2012.

When he could no longer look after himself at home, Robert moved to a nursing home in Moonee Ponds to be nearer his cousin Gwenneth Holmes, and later, to a nursing home in Glenroy. He adapted to the changes with his characteristic resoluteness and spent many hours walking, exploring the streets of Moonee Ponds. Robert received many visits from St Tom's members at his nursing homes. Maurie Hevern was probably his most regular visitor at Glenroy (and almost always took ice cream!).

Parish members remember Robert's gentlemanly and courteous manner, his wonderfully dry sense of humour, his smile, his deep Christian faith and his loyalty to and passion for the ministry of the parish. These were exhibited in many ways: through his Vestry membership, particularly as Parish Secretary - a role he fulfilled with meticulous care; English teaching from the inception of Saturday classes (where Samantha Tse was one of his pupils); his membership of the choir and his very clear and careful reading of the Bible during services. Living next door to the church, Robert often ended up with the mundane jobs, like locking up or putting out the garbage bins! And he did these without complaint.

Robert had a beautiful voice and loved singing in the choir (which Margaret organised). In fact, when Ida Mak gathered members of the congregation to sing Christmas carols at his nursing home a few years ago, Robert still sang strongly and kept the time.


One of Robert's lasting legacies was his crucial role as a Churchwarden in the resumption of negotiations towards the amalgamation of St Theodore's Wattle Park with St Michael and All Angels Bennetswood, after initial discussions had stalled. In the course of the further negotiations, it became clear that Robert was persuaded of the ministry benefits of the amalgamation and that this was where God was leading us. Robert was able to influence others of his parish to a like mind and in 2007, St Michael's and St Theodore's merged to become the parish of St Thomas' Burwood.

St Tom's and its work continues to benefit from both Robert and Margaret Craig's many contributions during their lives, for which we praise and thank God.

As Robert wished, we have used half the bequest to reduce our building loan and invested the remainder; the income from which will be used to support needy people in the parish.

### STATUTORY PARISH MEETING

#### MEETING DETAILS

- Sunday 19th March 2023 at 12.15pm (after 10.30 services)
- St Thomas' Anglican Church, 44 Station Street, Burwood Victoria
- To consider and vote on a proposed co-operative agreement with the Anglican Parish of St Edward's Blackburn South
- A quorum of 20 per cent of the members on the electoral roll is required at the meeting

Our possible partnership with St Edwards Blackburn South is rolling along in its organisation - thanks to the great work of our warden's and parish council. This partnership will require the formal agreement of both parishes.

To give our agreement as a church, we must hold a Statutory Parish Meeting. The churchwardens of St Thomas' will recommend that the meeting vote to endorse the proposed co-operative agreement, under section 57(2) of the Parish Governance Act 2013. Members enrolled on St Thomas' electoral roll are entitled to attend, speak and vote at the meeting. A quorum of 20 per cent of the members on the electoral roll is required at the meeting. Copies of the proposed agreement will be distributed to parishioners by email and hard copies will be available at St Thomas' from early March 2023.

An information and discussions session will be hosted on March 12th, 9:15am at St Toms.
