REFLECTION - DENISE CLARKE

What did you make of the Coronation of King Charles III four weeks ago? The Age's Europe correspondent described it as 'superb and absurd. Sublime and ridiculous. Majestic and outrageous. And, in parts, just plain weird'. commentator found it anachronistic because it was 'based on the lie' that Britain is a Christian, specifically Anglican nation. One letter to The Age said it was 'mind-numbing, full of empty platitudes, and soporific in the extreme'. Most agreed the music and costumes were spectacular, but found aspects of the ceremony, which is composed of a series of ancient rituals, somewhat puzzling, to say the least.

These reactions are not surprising. The ceremony was thoroughly saturated with biblical quotations and Christian symbols. It also included a service of Holy Communion. Christians are very familiar with all this, but others may well have found them puzzling or 'weird'.

At the very start of the service, King Charles was welcomed by a young boy 'in the name of the King of Kings'. And the King replied, 'In His name and after His example, I come not to be served but to serve.'; Two clear references to Jesus from Scripture (Revelation 19:16 and Mark 10:45). There were two readings from the New Testament: Colossians 1:9-17 (I wonder how the British Prime Minister, a Hindu, felt about reading that?) and Luke 4:16-21. In addition, all the hymns, songs and prayers were based on biblical texts. The Bible Society has compiled a complete list of the many biblical

references in the service.

So far, so good. But there were aspects to the service that I did find odd, even discordant and disturbing.

There was an emphasis on 'modernising' the service, but the Bible readings were taken from the King James Bible, the liturgy from the 1662 Book of Common Prayer, and the prayers mostly in archaic language. The impression was of the Church and Christianity as quaint and outdated.

King Charles was anointed with oil as the choir sang the magnificent Zadok the Priest, a clear reference to the anointing of King Solomon (1 Kings 1:32-39). But Charles is not a king of Israel. The promises relating to a future King or Messiah (both the Hebrew 'Messiah' and Greek 'Christ' mean 'anointed one) were fulfilled in Jesus.

Among other 'regalia' presented to the King was the Sovereign's Scepter and the Sovereign's Orb, and he was crowned with the St. Edward's Crown. All these carry the symbol of the cross, but it is a cross encrusted with jewels, set in gold. How good then that Archbishop Welby reminded us in his sermon that Jesus' 'throne was a Cross. His crown was made of thorns. His regalia were the wounds that pierced his body'.


How to Talk about Jesus

The referendum on a First Nations Voice to parliament provides a significant opportunity to stand with First Nations people in pursuing a more just and equitable shared future.

National Reconciliation Week, 27 May - 3 June 2023

Join us in prayer and action during National Reconciliation Week, the beginning of which marks the 65th anniversary of the 1967 Referendum. This week is a time for all Australians to learn about and reflect on our history and take steps towards a more reconciled and just future.

This year's National Reconciliation Week theme, "Be a Voice for Generations," encourages all Australians to actively promote reconciliation in tangible ways in our everyday lives - where we live, work, and socialise. In the lead up to the Voice referendum, let's take this opportunity to

reflect on the part we can play as Christ's "ambassadors of reconciliation.

First Nations leaders have invited us all to work with them to be ambassadors of reconciliation. As Professor Anne Pattel-Gray has said, First Nations people have been "wanting to... have a relationship that's based on restorative justice, that recognises what's been taken from us, and what needs to be given back in order to be reconciled."

We've created a <u>discussion guide</u> for churches shaped by the voices of First Nations Christian leaders for your church to reflect on as we engage in conversation on how the church can contribute to further justice and reconciliation today. The upcoming referendum provides us with an opportunity to stand with the First People of Australia and pursue reconciliation like we have in the past.
