REFLECTION - JOSHUA MILLARD

In January 2023 St Tom's commenced a project of building university ministry. This is not the first endeavour our church has made to serve students. What makes this attempt unique is having a full-time commitment to establishing university ministry, instead of a continuing sideproject. We are externally funded (60%) for this year, and we're given certain goals to meet. We aimed to have an evening congregation beginning this year, but this ambitious goal will not be reached. Our funding is periodically reviewed, and in August the funding body decided to continue the funding, despite not having reached where we would like to be in this time. We are now funded into next year, and are so grateful to God for the provision of this money. Our funding does reduce to 40% next year, so it is not without cost to continue.

One encouraging sign from the work this year has been a very happy relationship with the Christian Union (CU) group on campus at Deakin. I attend the Tuesday night main meeting, and contribute to CU where I can. They have also asked me to join in their public events.



As chaplain, I have tried to be as active as possible in meeting students. On my

campus days I set up a spot

with my wood carving, and a whiteboard with an invitational question: How do you know it's true love? Who's your hero? Etc. I have met local and international students in this time, and answered many questions from, 'Do you know where the LE building is?' to 'What is the message of Jesus?'

This is hard work. Not because I am working late hours or juggling pieces, but because so many things have to come together at once for this to succeed. I have to meet students, meet them in contexts where we can have an honest conversation, meet students who might come to an event, CU, or church, and be able to follow them up appropriately. There are thousands of Deakin students, but finding those who we can serve at the right moment, is hard work. Often it feels like I'm sitting around doing very little.

Please pray that our church can meet, serve, and invite students into sharing Jesus' life with us. Please pray for CU and for Power to Change (another student-based Christian group), that their mission would continue to succeed wonderfully,


Confronting Christianity (Book & Podcast)

Channeling state-of-the-art research, personal stories, and careful biblical study, Confronting Christianity explores 12 questions that keep many of us from considering faith in Christ. Look more

closely, McLaughlin argues, and the reality of suffering, the complexity of sexuality, the desire for diversity, the success of science, and other seeming roadblocks to faith become signposts. Jesus becomes not a relic from the ancient world, but our modern world's best hope.

INTRODUCING GOD ROCKS!

The first series of Introducing God at St Tom's has finished, and it was great fun! A mixed group of people: women, men, young, old, Anglo and ESL all joined together. We shared meals, watched the videos, talked, laughed, and worked through a thousand questions!

- Is the Bible God-inspired and how do we know this?
- How do science and creation fit together?
- How do you surrender to Christ if you want to?
- If you have a relationship with God does that change all your other relationships?
- Why are Christians like they are?
- If evil comes through people, then are all wars and suffering on us? And if that's the case, what do I do with the guilt?
- Is there some (I don't want to use the word)
 'magic' that means you can live for God?

On the final night someone (H) gave his life to Christ!!! It was amazing and very funny! To begin the session, I said: 'John was away last week - can you all tell him something he missed?' H. started with: 'YOU WOULDN'T BELIEVE IT! WE LEARNT THAT JESUS DIED TO BRING US THE FREE GIFT OF SALVATION!' (yes, it was loud). This was immediately followed by 'Do I have to change my whole life straight away if I became a Christian?'. After the video H. said 'I prayed the prayer! I'm on board with Jesus'.

The next Introducing God series starts on Monday October 9, and we're really looking forward to it! Invite your friends and come with them to this 6 week series. If you want to check out the videos start with this 'God, Us and the Meaning of Life'.
