## UPDATE PARISH COUNCIL

In November last year, St Toms was privileged to have Rod Morris run a Revisioning Workshop for our church.

At the workshop, we came up with the following vision as well as medium and short term goals and priorities.

#### Vision for St Toms

In 5-10 years (2034), St Tom's will be a thriving and growing church, joyfully living together as a cross-cultural, intergenerational family under Christ. Empowered by the Spirit, our people will be faithfully discipled, trained in God's Word, and supported to grow as followers of Jesus, leading and serving each

other, our local neighbourhoods, and our world in need.

We will be committed to deliberate local and global evangelism through relevant ministries.

#### Long-term strategic goals

Over the next 3 years we will emphasise:

Being a praying church

• Whole-of-life discipleship and effective small-group ministry, enabling people to use their gifts for mission, service, and outreach.

• Exceptional children's, youth & young adult's ministry.

• Effective integration, pastoral care and support of members, rejoicing in God's grace to us, and celebrating our common life as a multicultural church.

#### Short-term visionary goal

In 2025, we will strengthen engagement and commitment in our community life with a focus on strengthening relationships and pastoral care, with progress assessed quarterly, a church retreat, four events to encourage community, and a 20% increase in participation in church life.

#### IN THE NEXT 90 DAYS WE WILL STRIVE TO:



In the next 90 days [following the Revisioning Workshop] we will strive to:

- Articulate who we are, why we do what we do, and what our vision is (often).
- Do something to improve pastoral care by fixing the soundproofing and reducing noise levels.
- · Promote small group participation in the lead-up to the new year.
- Introduce a prayer diary to encourage prayer for the church.

Parish Council met on Tuesday 25 February 2025, our first meeting for the calendar year.

We are delighted to report that each of the goals identified at the Revisioning Workshop for action within the 90 days following the Workshop have been completed.

Parish Council will meet again at an extraordinary meeting on Tuesday 11 March to identify the actions and priorities for the next 90 days, in achievement of our mission and refreshed vision for St Toms.

We are also pleased to report that there has been an increase in offertory giving over the last few months. Parish Council would like to thank everyone who has contributed financially to the work of St Toms and particularly appreciates those members who have increased their giving, or started giving for the first time.

As you may be aware, the Anglican Diocese of Melbourne has entered a process of discernment of who might be called and elected to be the next Archbishop of Melbourne.

This follows the retirement of Dr. Philip Frier as our previous Archbishop on 9 February 2025 after 18 years of service in that role.

A Board of Nominators elected by Synod and chaired by Dr. Jenny George has been meeting since August 2024 to consider names of potential candidates to be brought to an Election Synod for voting by Synod members. The Board of Nominators has consulted widely across the Diocese and beyond for names of potential candidates.

It is proposed that the meeting of the Election Synod will be held on Friday 23 and Saturday 24 May 2025 at St Paul's Cathedral Melbourne. Our parish Synod representatives are Ruth Kernebone, Nai Cheong Mak and Nathan Ellis.

Please pray for the Board of Nominators as they undertake their important task; for our Synod representatives in preparing for and participating in the election; and above for the outcome of the election process – that our chief pastor of the Diocese will be someone of God's choosing, a leader of vision, a teacher of God's truth and a preacher of the good news of Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour and the Hope of the Nations.

It says in **1 Timothy 4:12** 'Let no one despise your youth, but set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity.' I have seen this through our young people and it is an honour to open God's word with them."

"Volunteering is such a rewarding experience. Not only are we called to serve each other as Jesus taught us, but it's just an awesome way to get to know others in our St Tom's community. It is so important to feel seen and known and feel like you belong. Taking part in volunteer roles gives you a sense of belonging and purpose. Before being on welcoming, I only knew a few people and wasn't confident to go up and chat with anyone. Now I have learnt most people's names and can have a conversation with people I didn't even know a year ago. As humans, we need community and we sometimes forget the gift of community Jesus gave us in establishing the church. We are so blessed to be able to lift each other up and share God's work freely. So let's make the best from what God has given us."

#### Thinking about volunteering but haven't jumped in yet? Abby has some great encouragement for you!



The entertainment was spectacular! We were treated to vibrant and colourful dance performances that filled the room with energy and excitement.



#### LENT: REPENTANCE AND LIVING A NEW LIFE WITH GOD'S GRACE

Lent is a quiet season in the church year, a time to pause and reflect on our lives. It directs us to Jesus' sacrifice on the cross and prepares us for the joy of Easter. During this journey, the Anglican Book of Common Prayer offers a guiding confession: "For the sake of your Son who died for us, forgive us, cleanse us, and change us. By your Holy Spirit, enable us to live for you." This prayer reminds us that repentance is not merely an apology, but a response to Christ's love, stirring us to transformation.

Recently, during Mission Sunday, I preach about this theme of repentance, a cornerstone of our faith. True repentance (contrition) mirrors David's cry in Psalm 51, a deep sorrow for offending God's holy law, seeking cleansing and renewal. This differs from Saul's shallow regret (attrition), driven by fear of consequences rather than a changed heart. Lent teaches us that repentance is not a one-time act, but a way of living in Christ's forgiveness. We recall our past mistakes, not to dwell in guilt, but to guard against repeating them; we remember Jesus' sacrifice, not just with gratitude, but with a commitment to holiness, allowing the Holy Spirit to continually renew us.

Lent invites the church to embrace this journey of grace together. It is not an individual pursuit, but a communal call-to support and encourage one another, letting repentance shape our lives. As we release our self-focus and turn to Jesus who died for us, His grace shines through our weaknesses. May this season mark a renewal for our church, a heartfelt response to God's love, living out a heavenly calling with the Spirit's guidance, until the light of Easter dawns.
